The Term '' mine risk education'' refers to ''activities which seek to reduce the risk of injury from mines and ERW by raising awareness and promoting behavioral change, including public information dissemination, education and training, and community mine action liaison''.

Mine Action Components:

- 1. Demining
- 2. Victim Assistance (VA)
- 3. Mine Risk Education (MRE)
- 4. Advocacy
- 5. Stockpile Destruction

Item one Article (2) of the first moderate law of the confession of IRCS number (86) in 2001 illustrated the following:

IRCS is a humanitarian institution and adapted the international humanitarian law (IHL) and the other agreements ratified by the governments .

Also article (6) item (3) refer to:

Each state party in position to do social provide assistance for the care and rehabilitation, and social and economic integration, of mine victims and for mine awareness programs. Such assistance maybe provided inter alia through United Nations systems international regional or national organizations of institutions, The International committee of the Red Cross, National Red Cross and Red Crescent societies and their international federation, Non-governmental organizations or on a bilateral bases.



IRAQI RED CRESCENT SOCIETY (IRCS) is a humanitarian society which is founded in 1932.

As a national society IRCS aims to reduce the suffering of the civilians during the war and peace.

(ERWA) is one of the programs that IRCS implemented, the program aims to decrease accidents resulting from Mines and UXOs by implementing an MRE campaigns in contaminated areas to urge the civilian to adopt more secure behavior towards ERW.

ERWA program activities are implemented in (15) province in Iraq except the three northern provinces, the activities included implementation of (lectures, galleries, workshops, plays, etc), distribution of ERWA materials like (posters, folders, snake and ladder, maze and T-shirts) distributed during the implementation of the activities.



There is a partnership between IRCS and ICRC in the field of ERWA in that matter ICRC presents its technical support in the field of capacity building in addition to limited financial support to implement some activities .

#### 1.General objective of ERWA program

the program aims to decrease accidents resulting from Mines and UXOs by implementing an MRE campaigns in contaminated areas to urge the civilian to adopt more secure behavior towards ERW.

# 2. HQ Activities

#### a. Materials

ERWA Promotions have been received from ICRC. All the materials have been distributed according to the distribution plan edited by program management were all included branches received their portions of the materials. ICRC covered all the expenses of designing , printing , and transporting . promotion materials detailed below:

# **b.** Meetings

- By the presence of IRCS secretary general, assistant secretary general of technical affairs , and the head of ERWA dept. a coordination meeting has been held, and in addition to the participants above the deputy head of delegation, ICRC / WeC coordinator, and WeC & Coop FO also participated in the meeting, during the meeting the final report of ICRC / EOD team has been submitted to the ICRC secretary general because their mission has been ended in Iraq. There were also mutual discussions and dialogues about the future of ERWA program in Iraq and the ways to develop it.
- Series of coordination and cooperation meetings have been held with ICRC to follow up ERWA activities implementation .
- Meetings have been held with the ministry of environment / DMA for preparing MoU between IRCS and the ministry of environment .
- A meeting has been held by UNICEF in Bagdad to discuss including ERWA subject in ministry of education curriculum and to review ERWA strategy of 2013-2015. The representatives of IRCS, the ministry of environment and the ministry of education participated in the meeting.
- Participation in the conference of preparing the strategy of ERWA 2013-2015 that organized by ministry of environment / Basra / May 2012.
- The head of ERWA department participated with representatives of other organizations in a meeting organized by ministry of environment / DMA to discuss the mines action issue in Iraq
- On 11 15/3/2012 The head of ERWA dept. has participated in a workshop which organized by the ministry of sport and youth in Missan as lecturer. The workshop concerned in (Mine MRE –VA –advocacy).
- Half annual meeting for ERWA BOs has been held during June 2012. The annual meeting of revision has been also held during November 2012.

# **C. Reports**

ERWA program management / HQ has issued 17 reports during 2012 that concerned with ERWA program activities (12 monthly reports) and (4 quarterly reports) in addition to the annual report of 2012. All the reports above have been sent to ICRC and the ministry of environment / DMA There were also another technical reports concerned with the training courses, workshops, meetings and field visits that ERWA officers have participated in.

# d. Joint field visits with ICRC

As a part of cooperation and coordination between IRCS and ICRC a field visit to Missan Branch has been implemented to deliver MRE session paralleled with ICRC / EOD team operations.

# e. Monitoring

Monitoring visit has been implemented by ERWA FO to Missan Branch.

# f. External participations

• Participation in the standing committees meeting of the Anti-personnel mine ban convention that held in Geneva in May /2012 where IRCS president delivered a speech on behalf of IFRC on this occasion.

• Participation in the twelfth meeting of states parties to the convention on the prohibition of the use , stocking ,production , and transfer of anti-personnel mines and on their destruction / Geneva /December 2012 .

Dr. Yassin Ahmed Abbas IRCS president delivered a speech on behalf of the international federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent.





# 2. Branches Activities

# a. Reports Issuing

160 monthly reports have been issued by ERWA units officers . All the reports have been unified by the program management / HQ and on that base the monthly , quarterly , and annual reports of 2012 have been issued .

# **b.MRE** Lectures

(580) lectures have been delivered by BOs. And volunteers in different governorates .

# c. Materials

ERWA materials distributed during the implementation of ERWA activities (7941posters, 20366 folders, 9892 Snake& Ladder, 5290 maze, 6571 time table, 12608 coloring book, 5914 pocket calendar and 330 T-Shirt) distributed.

# d. International day of mines awareness

For the anniversary of International Day of ERW (4 April), many celebrations achieved by Thiqar-Neneva- Babil – Najaf - Kirkuk-Karbala - Wassit- and Baghdad) branches.

# e. Training courses

ERWA units officers implemented series of training courses for ERWA program volunteers, these courses have been implemented by (Wassit-Diwaniya- Baghdad- Kirkuk-Diyala - Thiqar-Missan –Najaf).

# f. Sticking and Distribution Campaigns

(102) posters sticking campaigns have been implemented by ERWA units officers in different governorates.



# g. Billboards

ERWA unit officers in Wassit and Kirkuk, handed a proposal for making ,designing, and erecting billboards, where (24) billboards erected in the contaminated areas (14) in Wassit and (10) in Kirkuk.

# h. Warning Sings

Ten warning signs have been erected in Wassit Branch.

# i. Community Liaison



By the cooperation of the civil defence directorate, (17) clearness operations launched in Wassit Branch, ERWA units supported the civil defence by informing them about dangerous areas, initiating first aid team and implementing MRE campaigns in parallel with the clearness process.

# j. Exhibitions

ERWA officers units in( Missan, Najaf, Wassit, Diwaniya, Baghdad, Mothanna, Diyala, Anbar, Karbala, and Neneva branches) implemented photos exhibition about ERWA.

#### k. Plays

Three plays (on ERW and the safe behavior when face them) implemented by ERWA units officers in (Missan, Babil, and Baghdad governorates).

#### **I. Scout camps**

Four scout camps have been implemented on ERWA, (2) in Baghdad , (1) in Wassit ,and (1) in Al-Mothanna .

#### m. ERWA victims registration program

IRCS participated actively in the success of ERW victims registration program that implemented by ministry of environment / DMA in Wassit and Thiqar Branches .



#### n. IRCS/DMA Campaigns

Many ERWA campaigns have been implemented by ERWA unit officers in the governorates in cooperation with ministry of environment/ DMA.

#### o. Participation with Other Departments

ERWA units in the branches participated in implementing (203) activities with other departments.

#### p. Other activities
