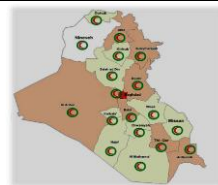

The Iraqi Red Crescent Society (IRCS) is an Independent, volunteer-based National Society that works to alleviate suffering for all. We are also an auxiliary body to public authorities/government when responding to humanitarian needs. However, we maintain our independence from authorities and function as an autonomous, apolitical, non-partisan organization. Our interventions alleviate the suffering for all, in accordance with the movement's fundamental principles since 1932

The IRCS main structure distributed on the 18 governorates including the capital Baghdad, 93 offices, with human power of 7530 volunteers 2195 staff beside our offices in Amman, Beirut and Tehran



MOSUL The second big governorate in Iraq with estimated 5.5 million population from different ethnic and sectarian origin living in harmony till 10th June 2014 when ISIS militants took control of the city center and surroundings, almost half of the population left in large waves of internally displaced people or refugees toward safe zone inside Iraq and neighboring countries respectively; yet almost 1.5 million still inside city center suffering severe agony and deprivation with high unemployment rate and bad economy as part of ISIS policies beside terrorism

After long preparations the Iraqi governments started the liberation operation joined by international coalition to salvage the great ancient city from ISIS oppression on early hours of 17th October 2016



The IRCS helps families regardless to bad weather!!!

13th -14th December 2016

The harsh weather started with dropping in temperature, blowing winds and raining, adding further burden on the IDPs families inside the camps and yet it did not stop the IRCS teams from serving them, summarizing the activities for the past 2 days as following: -

The IRCS Salahaddin, Babel and Karbala branches

1. Distribution of 6000 fresh bread to 300 families inside Tel-Sebat camp
2. Distribution of 750 relief pack to families in Jada'a 2 camp each family received food basket, 35Kg rice, hygiene sets, stove, kettle, 6 blankets, 2 Jerri cans, 2 towels and one thermos)
3. On 14th Dec. new 25 families arrived to Jada'a camp from west bank of Mosul they received immediate ready meals and water bottles
4. The health team on 13th December manage to have psychosocial support to 506 children but halted it on Wednesday due to deterioration of weather and focus on tent visit
 - Tent visit 36 for past two days
 - Different Psychosocial support activity benefited 352 Adult
 - Personal hygiene and prevention of leishmaniosis 123
 - 12 First aid lecture to 217 beneficiaries
 - First aid delivered to 25 person

The IRCS Erbil, Mosul, Baghdad branches

1. Distribution of 30000 fresh bread in the camps
2. Receiving 268 new families in Hasan Shame 3 with blankets, ready meals and water beside the psychosocial support and transportation
3. 2500 hot meals delivered to the families in camps
4. 752 medical cases treated in Khazer with Qatar Red Crescent
5. 310 medical cases treated in Hasan Shame night shift
6. 600 families received relief pack (each pack has one food basket, one hygiene set, kitchen set, stove, 2 Jerri cans and 6 blankets)
7. 155 cloth boxes with blankets and toys distributed with the Turkish Red Crescent beside 220 women gowns distributed with private donor
8. Distribution to 150 families baby sets (baby milk, baby bottles, diapers, water bottles with baby cerelac)
9. Distribution of 3 wheel chairs and one adult walking sticks
10. Rehabilitate 5 tents
11. Ambulances help to transport 9 cases inside the camps to medical clinic

The health team activities include the PSP open day 667 children, adult 1053 first aid delivered to 35 people while 58 received lectures on first aid. The Personal hygiene 614 families received education beside trash bags and soap block
