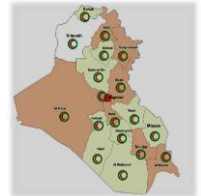
## MOUSL LIBERATION OPERATION BULLETIN

**The Iraqi Red Crescent Society (IRCS)** is an Independent, volunteer-based National Society that works to alleviate suffering for all. We are also an auxiliary body to public authorities/government when responding to humanitarian needs. However, we maintain our independence from authorities and function as an autonomous, apolitical, non-partisan organization. our interventions alleviate the suffering for all, in accordance with the movement's fundamental principles since 1932

**Programs** Relief, First Aid and health services, WATSAN, Dissemination and IHL, Youth, RFL and ERWA

Our Fundamental principles humanity, independence, impartiality, neutrality voluntary services, unity and Universality .The IRCS main structure distributed on the 18 governorates including the capital Baghdad , 93 offices, with human power of 7530 volunteers 2195 staff beside our offices in Amman .Beirut and Tehran



**MOSUL** The second big governorate in Iraq with estimated 5.5 million population from different ethnic and sectarian origin living in harmony till 10<sup>th</sup> June 2014 when ISIS militants took control of the city center and surroundings ,almost half of the population left in large waves of internally displaced people or refugees toward safe zone inside Iraq and neighboring countries respectively ;yet almost 1.5 million still inside city center suffering severe agony and deprivation with high unemployment rate and bad economy as part of ISIS policies beside terrorism

After long preparations the Iraqi governments started the liberation operation joined by international coalition to salvage the great ancient city from ISIS oppression on early hours of 17<sup>th</sup> October 2016



### The IRCS support families in Tel-Sebat Camp

17<sup>th</sup> December 2016

The south and south east zones of Mosul toward Salahaddin witness the growing in the number of IDP received at Tel-Sebat camp, Jada'a 1&2 where our teams are ready to support day or night beside camps to the east of Mosul (Khazer and Hasan shame)

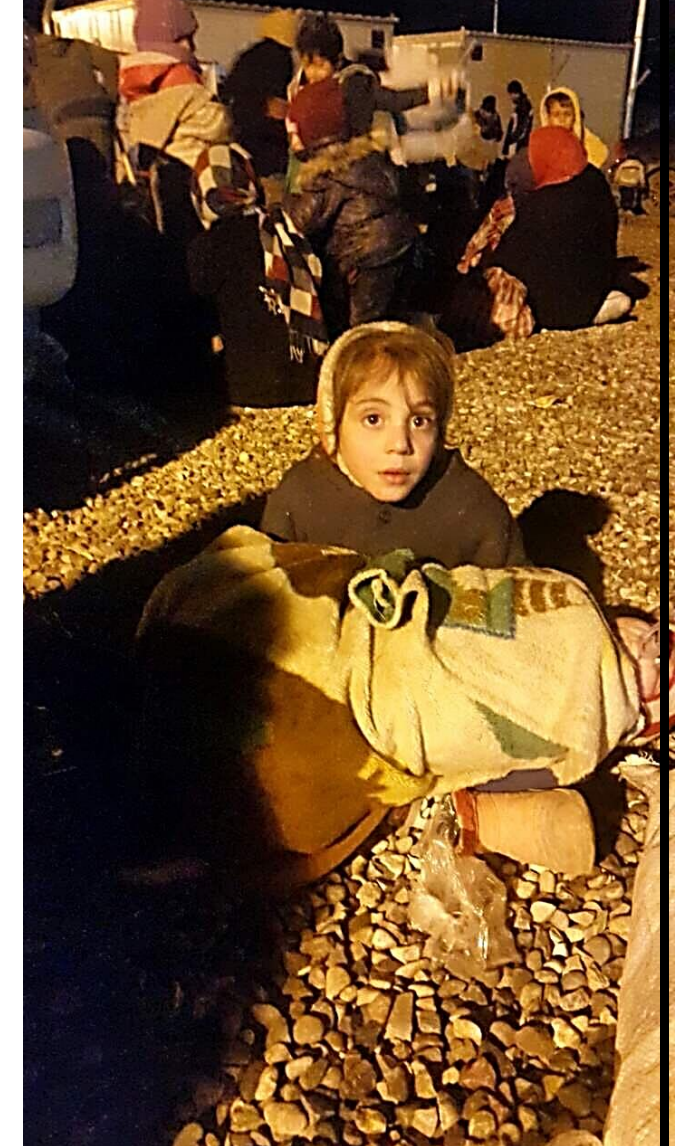
Summarizing the day activities inside the camps as shown below: -

#### 1. Team One Salahaddin, Babel and Karbala branches

- 3000 fresh bread distributed between 280 Families in Tel-Sebat camp and 20 in Al-Hajaj camps
- 20 new displaced families were received at Al-Hajaj camp and received water bottle and ready meals
- Distribution 473 Relief package to families in Tel-Sebat camp each relief pack contain (food baskets ,35Kg rice, stove, hygiene set, kitchen sets, kettle ,3 blankets and 2 towels)
- 3 medical cases were transferred to Qayara Hospital by our ambulances
- Jada'a2 camp psychosocial support was open day to 320 children, different support programs to 30young men and 47 adults
- 4 lectures of first aid to 54 beneficiaries
- 4 lectures of Health promotion to 32 beneficiaries
- Distribution of 75 First aid bag beside 18 families received first aid items

#### 2. Team Two Erbil, Mosul and Baghdad branches

- Night Arrival of 88 families distributed between Khazer and Hasan Shame; Khazer received 54 families while 34families arrived to Hasan Shame
- Distribution of 15000 fresh bread inside the camps
- 1500 hot meal delivered to the new arrived families
- 432 medical cases treated in Khazer with the Qatar RC
- 123 Medical cases treated at night shift
- 130 relief package distributed to new families between Khazer and Hasan Shame. each package contain (food basket ,35 Kg rice, hygiene set, kitchen set, stove and 2 Jerri cans)
- The health teams psychosocial support program between the 2 camps had Open day to 145 children while adult program for 311 adults
- First aid lectures to 34 beneficiaries
- Health promotion and personal hygiene with distribution of trash bags to 65 families
