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Summary

We can call 2021 was the worst year for COVID-19 pandemic worldwide in the total case numbers and the death rates including Iraq beside its tremendous negative impact on the socioeconomic state and world economy that may take many years to recover after the end of this pandemic

Despite the fight against the pandemic took a new level with the mass vaccination and personal safety and restriction with lockdowns yet we witness new variants outbreak the latest was Omicrons

Iraq has kept its rank as number one among the Arab countries in its COVID-19 total cases and death rate, that further burden the Iraqi people to endure all the turmoil that affect their country due to corrupted economy, high unemployment rate and major reduction in its quality and quantity in the government public services

The Iraqi Red Crescent Society developed its budget for 2021 based on the availability of the financial resources that are becoming more difficult with the world economy and yet it succeeded in reaching more vulnerable people than anticipated and support more families during many additional disasters like terrorist attacks, flood, droughts, isolation hospital fires and the rising prices of food and essentials due to default of its currency against the USD which was immediate impact on the local markets

In this report we will summarize the Iraqi Red Crescent Society and its partner's activities during 2021 that can demonstrate the extent of reaching out to the vulnerable in different services in parallel with building the national society capacities to accomplish more and better services for Iraqi people and humanity

The Iraqi Red Crescent Society (IRCS)

The Iraqi Red Crescent Society; is an Independent, volunteer-based National Society that works to alleviate suffering for all. We are also an auxiliary body to public authorities/government when responding to humanitarian needs. However, we maintain our independence from authorities and function as an autonomous, apolitical, nonpartisan organization. Our interventions alleviate the suffering for all, in accordance with the movement's fundamental principles since 1932; we operate inside and outside Iraq, as we are part of the International Movement of the Red Cross Red Crescent and guardian of the international law and treaties

Our Fundamental principles humanity, independence, impartiality, neutrality voluntary services, unity and universality

Our volunteers and staff are part of their local communities and they serve during peace and nature or manmade disaster, our major Programs ranges between Relief, First Aid and health and medical services, water and sanitation (WATSAN), Dissemination of the International Humanitarian Law (IHL), Youth activities, Restoring family links (RFL) and Awareness programs for the war remnant (ERWA) and women community forum.

We aid the public in all ceremonies and public events besides sponsoring youth activities.

IRCS main structure distributed on the 18 governorates including the capital Baghdad, 83 offices, with human power of 11853 volunteers 2400 staff beside our office in Amman



The Situation in Iraq 2021

1) **COVID-19 Pandemic** cases number increased triple than in 2020 as many affected countries Iraq total case number in 2020 was 596193 cases jump to 2093740 by the end of 2021 and death rate from 12824 to 24159 people. we faced the 3rd wave between Feb 27th - Sept. 19th and the peak number record was on July 29th were we had 13259 cases /day

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- Lockdowns and curfews was eased after July 2021 that helped private sector and small business to resume their work for a certain extent
- On march 2021 the Iraqi Ministry of health started vaccination campaign against COVI-19 yet by the end of the year they were able to deliver vaccination to 1/8 of the population of 42 million ¹
- 2) The Iraqi Economy had additional blow to socioeconomic status when the government decided to default the Iraqi dinar value to USD by 20% causing rise in the food and essential items prices since we depend on trade and exporting almost all While Iraq's economic conditions are gradually improving as international oil markets recover, this recovery is also fraught by major risks posed by structural bottlenecks, including public investment management constraints that have impacted public service delivery, the slow clearance of arrears (especially those related to public wages), and large exposure of state-owned banks and the central bank to the sovereign. These fragilities are aggravated by fragile political conditions, a weak healthcare system, and rampant corruption that continue to trigger unrest across the country.²
- 3) The Unemployment rate is 10% due to the mentioned caused above that further burden the Iraqi families
- 4) **Climate Changes** The high deficit in precipitation in some areas of Iraq, in addition to the rising temperature above 50° C for 3 months between July and September and low water supply from neighboring countries, had a negative effect on surface water levels. Causing limit people's access to water for consumption or agriculture. This affected mostly people on the mid-east and the south of the country³.
- 5) **Additional Crises** that shook the public to a huge extent due to number of dead, injured people and affected livelihood in addition to the pandemic victims were the IRCS was the first responder and provided its services to all the victims and their families

We can chronologically summarize the major crisis as following: -

- 1. Terrorist bombing in Baghdad Jan.21st
- 2. Isolation hospital fire incidence in Thi-Oar July 12th
- 3. Terrorist bombing in Baghdad July 19th
- 4. ISIL attack in Diala on 26-27th Oct
- 5. Floods KRG 30th Oct. and Dec.17th

These crises distributed in different locations inside Iraq with our staff and volunteers networks we were able to reach them immediately and help in evacuation, first aid, ambulance transfer and medical services followed by different relief items including food, nonfood items and psychosocial support and many time we supported the affected families through our cash donations beside some of them even benefited from our different programs that we will mention in this report

The IRCS was able to conduct 10730 activities during 2021 and build its capacities in order to upgrade and develop its services to reach out more vulnerable inside and outside Iraq

In 2021 we reach almost 15M beneficiaries; double what we targeted in our 2021 annual budget and we take the opportunity to appreciate the supports from our partners and cooperation of the federal, local and public authorities.

A. Preparedness and Response

1. The Disaster Management (DM)

The DM department executed many activities during 2021 based on 2020 assessment of the vulnerable families whom affected with the COVID -19 crisis directly and indirectly due to the economic impact in addition to supporting the families whom were victims of terrorist attacks or flooding

The Joint operation task team of the IRCS is leaded by the DM with membership of all the departments to ensure the best preparedness and response in crisis

In cooperation with other departments were able to reach the vulnerable families affected with the climate changes specially the drought

They response to these families based: -

- 2020 survey assessment show a total of 100000families need our support
- During 2021 survey and assessment show increase in vulnerable families with total of 112823 families distributed all over the country
- First responder activities to reach families in crisis as in 2021 terrorist acts, drought and flooding
- In collaboration with the health team during their campaign they also were able to deliver awareness
 and education of the COVI-19 prevention beside decontamination many public places with spread of
 aerosols
- Many of the families receive multiple support due to their vulnerability and need assessment
- The DM department supported through its following program 83983 families specially in Ninawa, Erbil, Baghdad and Thi-Qar

2. Health and Medical Services

Health department secure different programs to support the vulnerable families with health programs and medical services to ensure safety and wellbeing of the vulnerable people in their daily life and to save lives and prevent diseases during crisis. The health department serve through wide health spectrum with major pillars of first aids, health education and promotion and psychosocial support.

It played major role in peace with crowd gathering and in disaster or conflicts because of its preparedness continues training of its staff and volunteers

During 2021 the health and medical services provided by this department can be summarized as the following: -

2.1 Health Promotion and Education

During the COVID -19 pandemic most of the Health promotion and education was diverted for preventive measures against COVID-19 and promotion of the vaccinations and personal safety through different means including:

- Movie production, printing materials as poster, flyers beside the visual audio as local TV and radio Station, billboard and social media (Facebook, Instagram and twitter accounts) since the beginning of the pandemic till now the IRCS distributed more than 4 million printing materials inside Iraq
- The IRCS in July 2021 introduced a phone call service (Tabbebuka /your doctor) for medical advice and consultations more than 4200 calls within 140 days' period
- We also distributed 14500 Hygiene kits to vulnerable families
- In a total 878610 beneficiaries from the health promotion services

2.2 Psychosocial Support(PSP)

The IRCS health department support all the people on need with psychosocial support regardless their position, gender or age based on the trauma or condition they are facing or affected by During the COVID-19 pandemic there were many issues that need to be dealt with as

- Stigma of being infected and the panic among the families
- The grief of the lost ones
- The deterioration of the socioeconomic status
- The terrorist attacks that coincided with the pandemic as in Tayaran square and Saddar city bombing more than 240 the affected families
- The domestic violence rate that increased with the lockdown



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Psychosocial support and assurance helped the people to alleviate their state and face their challenges Many of these session happened through house visit and face to face talks with the trained volunteers from their own communities and considering the Iraqi culture and traditions


As an outcome during 2021 the PSP team conducted 1150 activities assisting more than 14412 beneficiaries

2.3 First Aid Services and Training

During 2021 the First aid conducted 704 training for different communities and public facilities for dissemination of the first Aid among the public for better reactions during any accident with support of these training with first aid kits

Also they conducted a drill exercise with the civil defense authorities in 4 governorates

Yet in 2021 the IRCS first aid services exceeded 3 .5 million people for the following occasions:





- 2.3.2 **Thi-Qar Hospital fire incidence** on July 12th a center for COVID-19 isolation had fire incidence were 92 people died and more than hundred were wounded the IRCS team help with first aid in cases of difficulty in breathing, suffocation, burn and wounded providing first aid and transfer to nearby hospitals. also the team continued with evacuation and debris removal
- 2.3.3 **Crowd management in the different annual occasions** where mass gathering of people.in 5 major occasions During 2021 the IRCS continued its presence and activities to support the families.

the IRCS health teams provide 11 water tankers carrying disinfectants materials and 25 ambulances to help in evacuation beside the fixed and mobile medical units in to ensure enough services are provided

2.4 Evacuation Medical Services (EMS)

The IRCS introduced since 2015 Emergency evacuation service through a fleet of well-equipped ambulances and highly trained paramedics to evacuated all kind of emergency cases medical or surgical and since then the IRCS increased the capacity of this services by adding more ambulances and increased the number of active staff to reach more vulnerable people in peace or crisis with a fleet of 35 ambulances

These teams are highly appreciated by the local communities for their humanity, neutrality and professionalism in their duties In 2021 the EMS are stationed in many locations inside the country which are distant to local hospitals and weak or absent ambulance services

Since 2017 the IRCS had added new services to support the families during the Mousel liberation operation with medical services by

installing fixed medical units in the camps and supported Ministry of Health Primary health centers with its running cost and medications to ensure better medical services access to vulnerable family, In the same year we added Mobile Medical Units (MMU) that can reach many families despite the security lockdowns or curfews

Since then the IRCS expanded its fleet of MMU to be 10 that are distributed to many locations inside Iraq with their medical teams and medication to reach rural areas with no access to public medical services specially with COVID-19 crisis where the government facilities were overwhelmed with the rising number of COVID-19 cases the following table will explain the distribution of these MMU or the Fixed Mobile Unit and the number of beneficiaries during 2021

These medical services were also a port for delivering community based health and family education to the local communities

Most of the cases received are treated on location and are visited regularly yet 143 were transferred to the IRCS hospital for secondary services supported by the IRCS

3. WatSan (Water and Sanitation)

Iraq make major part of Mesopotamia; the land that introduce agriculture to civilization due to abundance of water and rich soil yet with decades of mismanagement of its water resources in specific, the drought with or without flood become a trend that are recurrent based on the season. Many agricultural areas are deserted and people find difficulties to access safe water for them and their animals.

The IRCS had supported many areas with potable water through number of installed RO units or water trucking, the Watsan department is responsible to provide this service as well as maintaining these unit, we also supported many schools and governmental medical facilities with addition rehabilitation services of their water and sanitation structure



The Watsan team continue to survey all location and asses their water shortages and number of families beside its infrastructure and continue on annual basis with this task due to growing need to access potable water

Our target to provide 28.3L/ day/person




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COVID -19 PUBLIC SANITATION







B. IRCS Mandate

4. The Programs

This department is providing the services through the following mandate Restoring family links (RFL), dissemination and Explosive Ruminant of War Awareness (ERWA)

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4.1 Restoring The Family Link (RFL)

Due to long history of wars and conflicts in the past decade with people movements inside and outside the country, families lost connection with their members and we assist them in locating them and open channels for communication in cooperation with the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) and local and governmental authorities and human rights organization

During 2021 the RFL team achieve the following

- Deliver to the ICRC 1955 request of SAR, IRR and IQZ
- Receive 5 reply
- Sustain the communication with the families specially the detainees or missing during the wars or immigration and their rights
- Missing in Iraq-Iran war between 1980-1988 and their fate

4.2 ERWA

Iraq is still high contaminated with UXO or personal landmines due to long history of war and conflict that are distributed unevenly in many locations and are also subjected to landslides or floods making them hazardous to people in the adjacent area specially children

Most dense contaminated areas are the eastern border and the south of the countries. we collaborate with the Ministry of interior, ministry of environment and civil defense in the federal government in delivering awareness and education about the hazard to local communities

During 2021 we provide our services of cooperation and surveying the victims beside the awareness as listed below
