RAFAH GOVERNORATE

GENERAL CONTEXT

- Rafah crossing remains closed since the 7th of May which has led to the deterioration of the already devastated humanitarian situation in the Gaza Strip.
- According to the UN, more than 800,000 people were displaced from Rafah towards Khan Younis & Deir Al Balah causing an increase in their humanitarian needs.
- The occupation has not allowed patients transfer through the Rafah crossing.
- No humanitarian aid is allowed into the Gaza Strip: no fuel, no gas, no food and no relief items are reaching Palestinians.
- Al Najjar hospital & Specialized Kuwaiti hospitals are out of service.

- PRCS branch in Khirbet Al Adas in eastern Rafah was damaged due to heavy bombardment.
- PRCS is running its humanitarian operations in Rafah from the PRCS facility in Al Mawasi in Khan Younis governorate (western Rafah).
- EMS teams are prevented from working in the eastern Rafah area. Therefore, EMS teams have been distributed across 3 locations in the governorate to ensure rapid response.
- Al Quds medical post was moved from Al Mawasi Rafah to Al Mawasi Khan Younis.
- Medical services at Al Nasr medical, Al Attar & Park points are halted due to heavy bombardment in the area. One medical point (Tel Al Sultan in western Rafah) is still operational in Rafah.
- 2 IDPs camps are still in Rafah after dismantling a third one to be moved to Al Mawasi Khan Younis.
- Aid consignments are halted due to the closure of the Rafah crossing by the occupation.

Khan Younis Governorate

PRCS has restored operations in the ophthalmology, surgery and orthopedics departments at Al Amal Hospital. The medical teams have started doing surgeries. Around 284 different surgeries have been done between 30\4\2024 - 31\5\2024.

Services provided in the governorate:

- EMS services center (reopened on 19\5\2024)
- 10 IDP camps which host 1,110 families
- 1 Advanced Medical Post (Closed temporarily)
- 2 Primary health care centers
- 1 Medical point
- Relief assistance distribution

CENTRAL GOVERNORATE

- EMS & relief teams are operational 24/7.
- PHC services are provided in Deir Al Balah clinic
- 30 displaced families are housed at the branch.
- 2 IDP camps house 100 families.
- 3 Medical points

GAZA GOVERNORATE

- Gaza Branch, EMS center & Al Quds Hospital have not been operational since 14/11/2023.

In coordination with the WHO, PRCS has succeeded in facilitating the entry of 4 ambulances with its teams (each with 2 EMTs) to provide EMS services to Palestinians in Gaza and North Gaza governorates. The ambulances are located in Al Ahli Hospital in Gaza city.

NORTH GAZA GOVERNORATE

North Gaza Branch & EMS center endured significant destruction.

- PRCS Advanced Medical Post in Jabalia stopped its services due to heavy bombardment in the area. Therefore, Mobile medical teams have been deployed to different areas inside Jabalia.

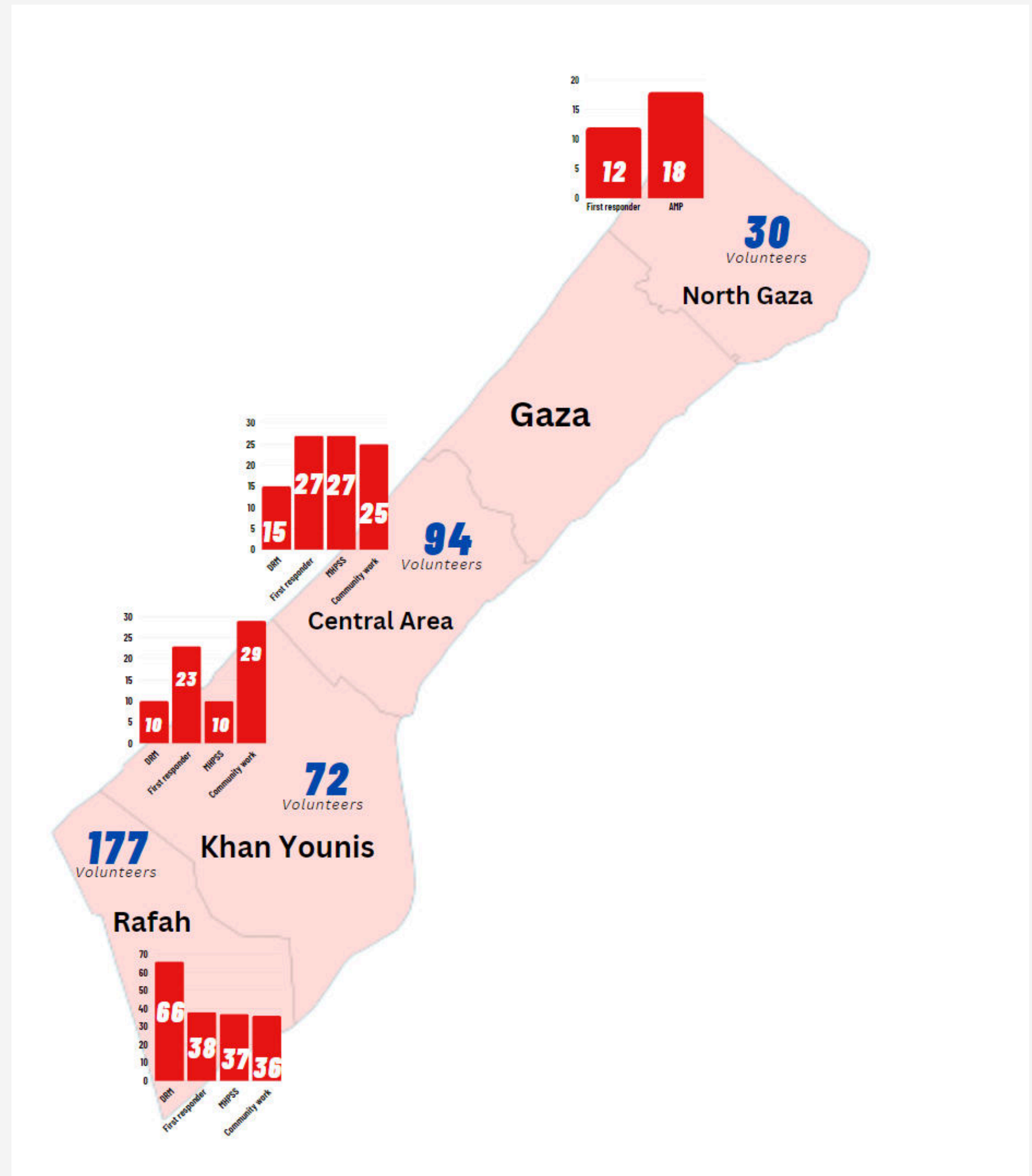

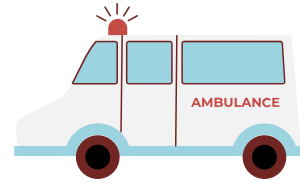




**Humanitarian Intervention

- Emergency Medical Services (EMS)
- Community health services & health awareness
- Psycho social support



18,646 injured persons received first aid services & **6,423** fatalities were evacuated by PRCS teams.



198,169 individuals benefiting from community health services & health awareness activities.



77,685 individuals benefiting from psycho social support activities.

These services are being offered across the displacement camps established by PRCS, at their medical posts, as well as in shelters managed by UNRWA.

Al Amal Clinic (inside PRCS Al Amal Hospital) in Khan Younis has resumed providing its medical services to residents who have moved back to the area after the withdrawal of occupation forces. The PRCS clinic is the main health care provider in Al Amal area its adjacent neighborhoods.

Medical services at Al Nasr medical point, Al Attar medical point, park medical point, and Al Quds point have been halted due to heavy Israeli bombardment in Rafah Governorate. Jabalia Advanced Medical Post was closed due to heavy shelling in the region.

PRCS has set up **14** camps for Internally Displaced People (IDPs)

Humanitarian interventions in the Gaza Strip from 7\10\2023 to 31\5\2024

Distribution is disrupted due to the closure of Rafah crossing.

- Food parcels are regularly distributed to the IDPs.
- Non food Items including kitchen sets, blankets & mattresses were distributed.
- Water, sanitation & hygiene\dignity kits have been provided.

Relief Items Distribution

7\10\2023 - 31\5\2024

The distribution of relief items has been disrupted due to Rafah crossing closure on 7\5\2024. As for PRCS inventory, it is being prioritized to the most vulnerable families.

On 27\5: PRCS received exceptionally 4 aid trucks of food parcels through Karem Salem crossing after being held at the crossing for more than 20 days.

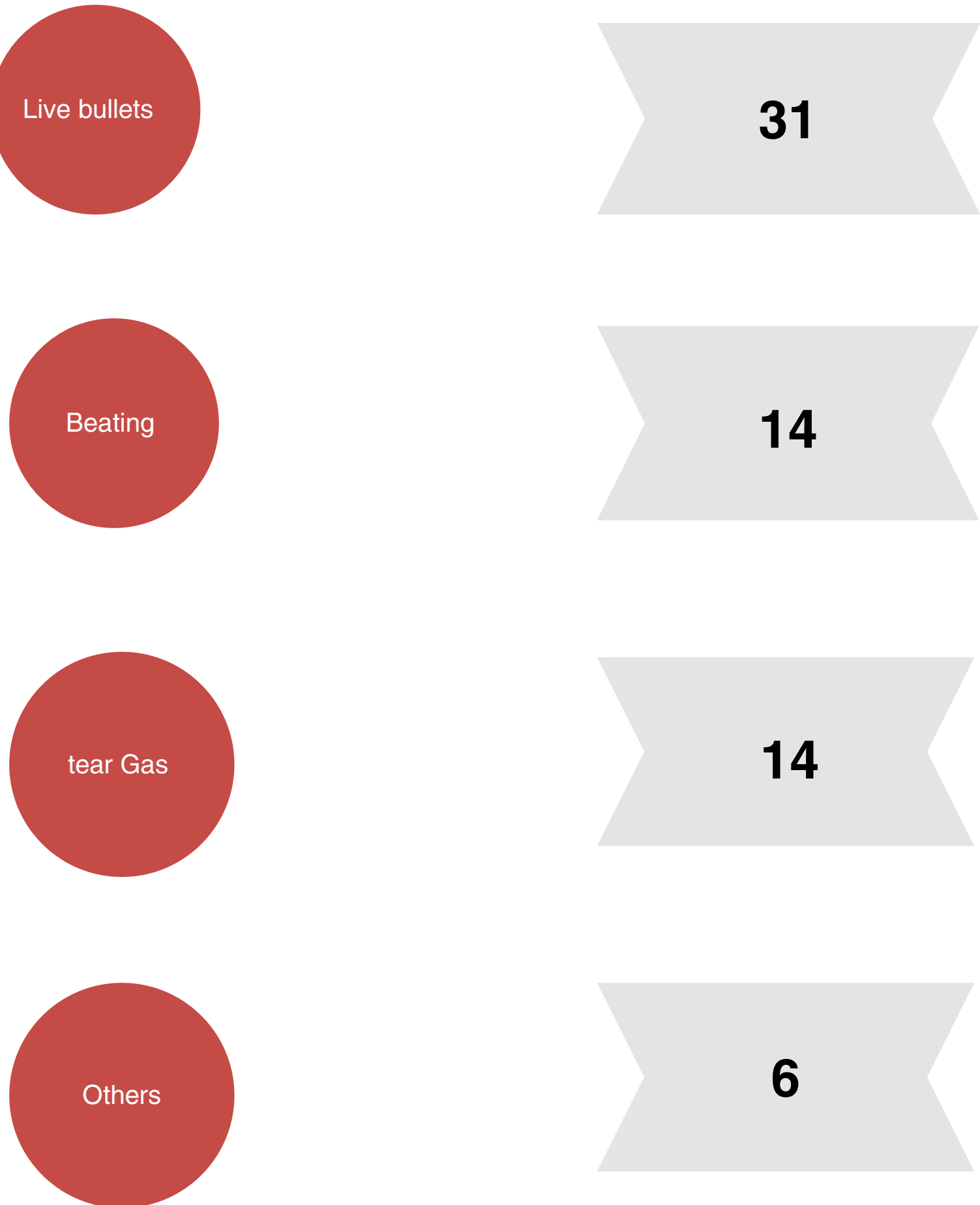
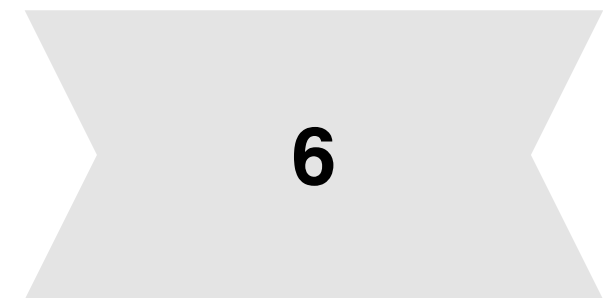
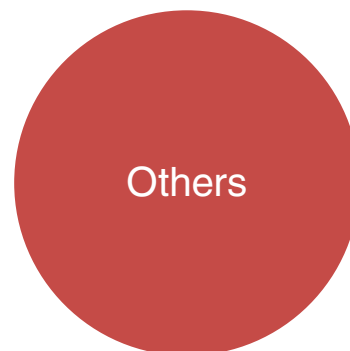
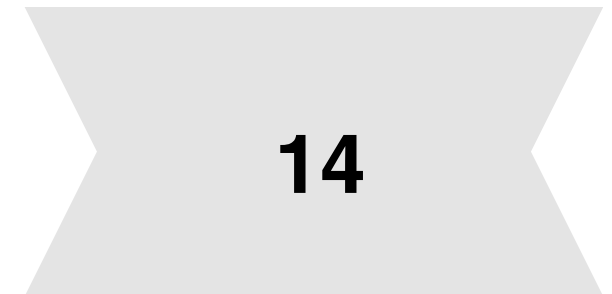
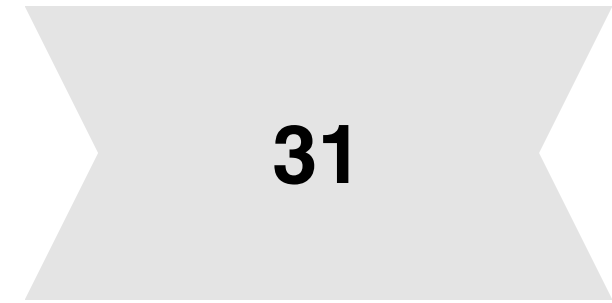
During the reporting period, PRCS in cooperation with Turkish RC distributed 4,000 food parcels benefiting 22,000 persons in Al Mawasi area in Western Khan Younis.

Relief Items Distribution

- As of October 2023, up until the current reporting period, the relief assistance has reached an estimated **(285,910)** families, consisting of **(1,572,505)** individuals, across the Gaza Strip including PRCS's camps, headquarters, and UNRWA-affiliated shelters.
- Relief assistance includes distribution of food parcels, hygiene kits, blankets, mattresses, water jerry cans, kitchen kits and other necessities

**Humanitarian intervention
in the West Bank
from 21\5\2024 - 31\5\2024**

Throughout this period, PRCS responded to (7) fatalities, and provided emergency medical services to **(65)** injured persons distributed as follows:



- Between the 21st and the 23rd May, in Jenin Refugee Camp, Israeli forces carried out a military operation. Eleven Palestinians were killed and over 15 injured. PRCS, in cooperation with ICRC, conducted rapid assessment for around 200 out of 800 affected families in order to provide relief assistance.

- **Challenges faced during the assessment:**

1. Difficulty moving around inside the camp due to the destruction of the streets and roads.
2. The presence of UXO explosive remnants.
3. Absence of residents in their homes because of fear of repeated raids.

- **PRCS teams responded to 6 fatalities and provided EMS services to 14 injured.**
- **Relief assistance was distributed to 10 families comprising 77 persons. Distribution included hygiene kits, dignity kits, blankets, mattresses, and tarps.**
- **PRCS will continue providing relief assistance to affected families in the coming days in coordination with ICRC, UNRWA and the refugee camp local committee.**
- **PRCS teams conducted psychological first aid activities benefitting 88 children.**

**Violations against PRCs
medical mission in the oPt:
7\10\2023 - 31\5\2024**

PRCS lost two more emergency medical technicians (EMTs) in the Gaza Strip. Haitham Tubasi and Suhail Hasouna were killed by Israeli occupation while on duty in Tel Al Sultan, on 29\5\2024.

The occupation directly targeted one of 3 ambulances which were en route on a humanitarian mission in western Rafah.

The deliberate targeting of PRCs's medical mission represents a grave infringement of International Humanitarian Law, (IHL) notably violating the Geneva Conventions

Emergency Appeal:

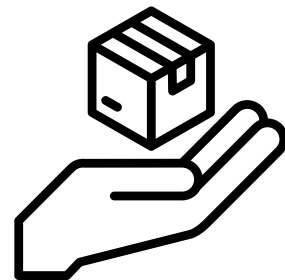
- To respond to the increasing humanitarian needs arising from the Israeli aggression on the Gaza Strip, the PRCS launched its second revised emergency appeal on 12/12/2023.



- **The appeal sought \$ 298,736,550** in funds from partners and supporters within the international Movement of the RCRC, non movement as well as local & international entities.
- As of 10\3\2024, contributions from a variety of national societies, international organizations, and the private sector **have fulfilled 20% of the requested cash funds.**

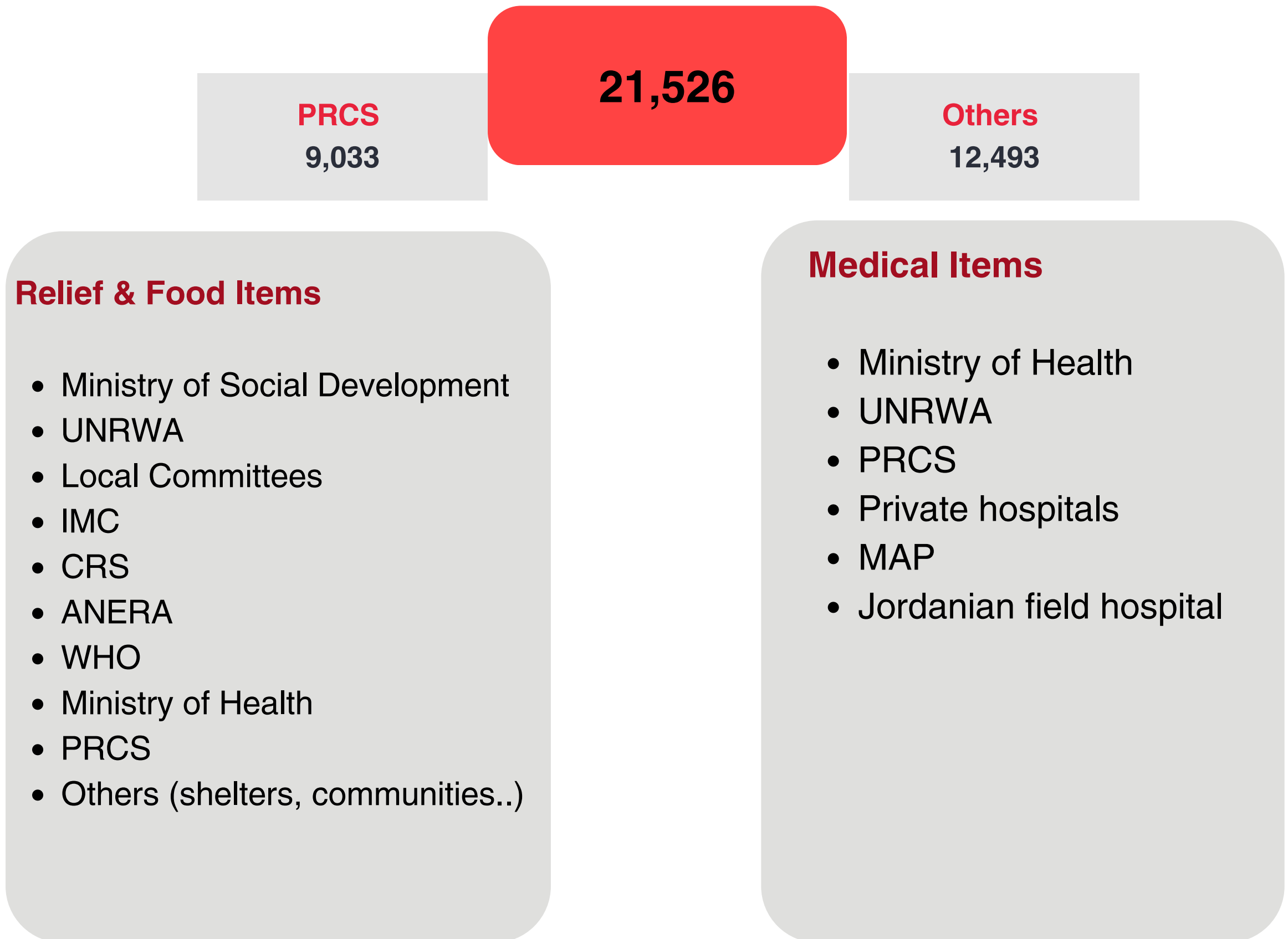

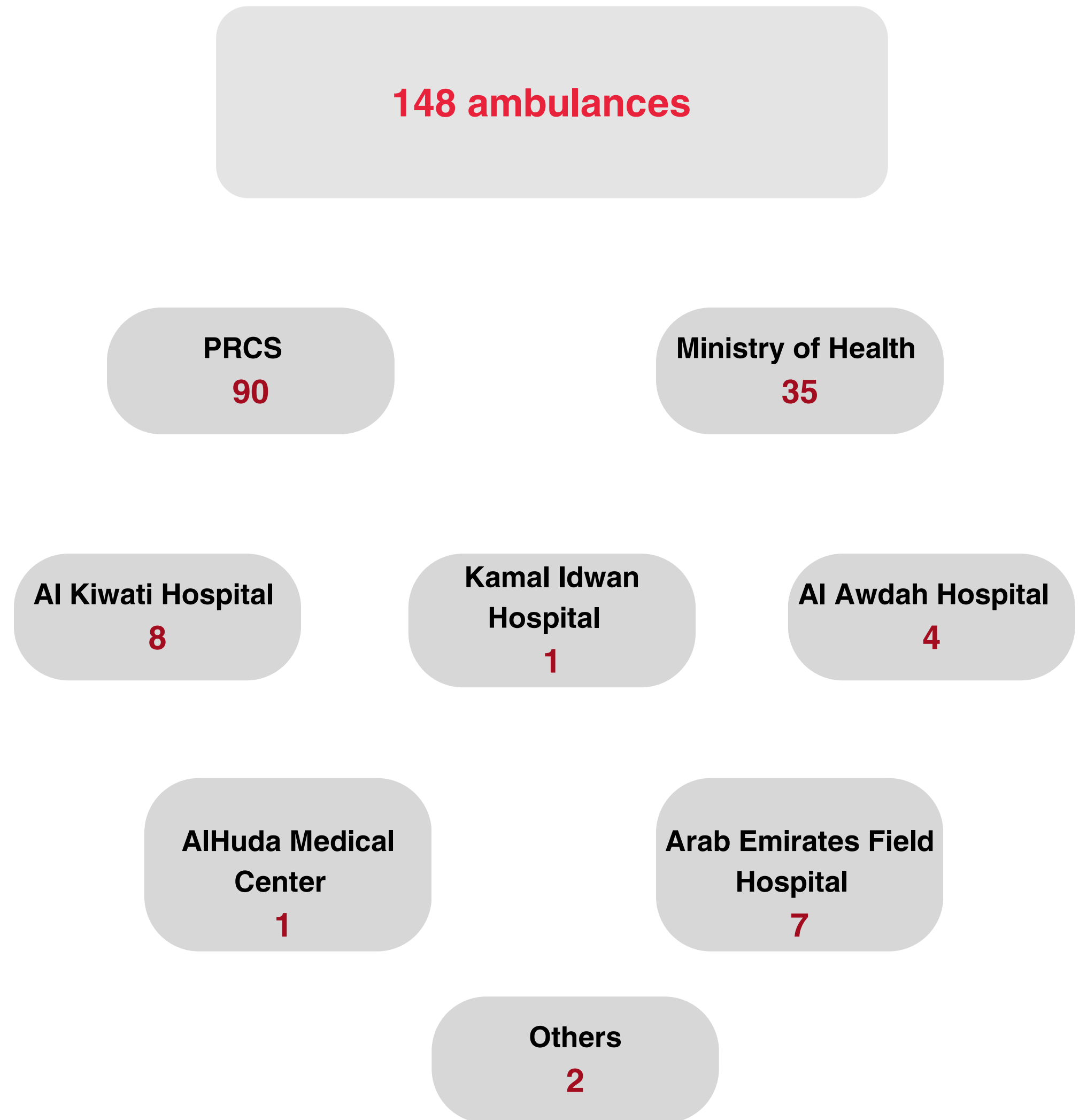
Distribution of Aid Trucks (In-Kind Donation)
